

Ton Dietz is a human geographer who has worked in and on Africa since 1975. He is professor in African Development at Leiden University and director of the African Studies Centre in Leiden. He is also guest professor at the University of Amsterdam and participates in the Governance of Inclusive Development research group, where he co-developed the PADev method (Participatory Assessment of Development). In Leiden he was involved in the Tracking Development project comparing (agricultural) growth and transformation in Africa and South-East Asia, followed by 'Developmental States in Africa' (together with ODI London), and the Digging Deeper project, result of the ASCL Collaborative Group "Food Security and the African City: clustering metropolitan food chains".
